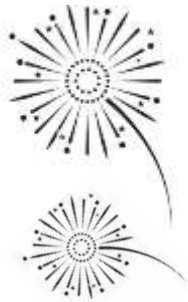



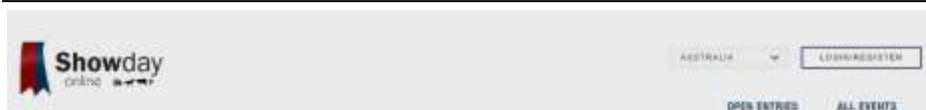

# How to lodge an entry on Showdayonline



1. Go to <https://showday.online/events-open>
2. Create a new account or login to your account using your previous details from our old website – If you have forgotten your password please contact [support@showday.online](mailto:support@showday.online) to get your account transferred over to our new website.
3. Select 2023 KUNUNURRA AGRICULTURAL SHOW
4. Click on PLACE AN ENTRY
5. Click on INDIVIDUAL ENTRY
6. In Exhibit Name select your Entrant from the drop down or click on ADD NEW to add a new entrant to your account
  - If clicking Add New fill out your Entrants name. Other fields are optional
6. In EXHIBIT TYPE select either:
  - INDOOR / DISPLAY
  - FARM ANIMAL
  - HORSES & CATTLE

For Horses & Cattle in EXHIBIT NAME select your animal name or click on ADD NEW to add a new animal to your account. If clicking Add New fill out your Animals name. Other fields are optional.
7. Click on SELECT CLASSES.
8. From the drop down choose the Section you would like to enter.
9. On the pop up tick the box to accept the entry notes for this section.
10. Click the PLUS symbol beside the section you are entering to expand to the classes.
11. Click on the class or classes you are entering to select them.
12. If entering multiple items into the same class, increase the QTY counter to reflect the number you would like to enter.

# International Year of Millets

*The International Year of Millets stands to provide a unique opportunity to increase global production, ensure efficient processing and consumption, promote a better utilisation of crop rotations, and encourage better connectivity throughout food systems to promote millets as a key component of the food basket.*



Millets are among the first plants to be domesticated and are considered "nutri-cereals" due to their high nutritional content. They have served as a traditional staple for hundreds of millions of people in Sub-Saharan Africa and Asia for 7,000 years, and are now cultivated across the world. However, their cultivation is declining in many countries, and their potential to address climate change and food security is not being realised in full. This is despite the fact that millets can grow on relatively poor soils and under adverse and arid conditions, with comparatively fewer inputs than other cereals.

## **Millet in the Ord Valley**

We use millet here for hay, cover cropping and seed production for planting seed.

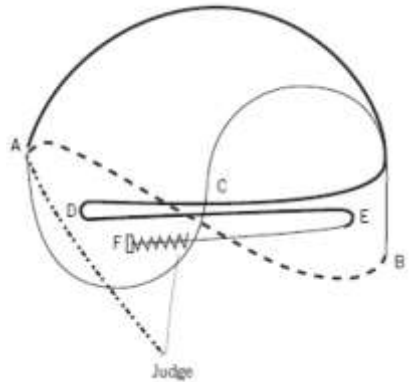

2. Rising trot from Judge to A
3. Track right along diagram sitting trot to B
4. Track left and canter a half circle in centre flying change at C
5. Canter half circle to the right to A
6. Gallop around back of arena and through middle of the arena
7. At D haunch turn to the left
8. Gallop to E with a haunch turn to the right
9. Canter to F and stop, rein back 3 metres
10. Walk back to judge on light rein

### Conditions of Entry

1. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, alter or combine any event / class to accommodate entries, safety and enjoyment as deemed necessary on the day.

### Sweet Potato, Apricot and Pecan Loaf

Serves 8

100g dried apricots, chopped into 1cm pieces  
Finely grated zest of 2 lemons, juice of 1½  
1 sweet potato (about 250g), roasted & cooled  
125g caster sugar  
3 eggs  
125ml sunflower oil  
75g wholemeal self-raising flour  
100g self-raising flour  
75g pecans, roughly chopped  
300g cream cheese  
100g icing sugar

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C. Grease and line a large loaf tin and set aside.  
Put the apricots in a bowl, then finely grate in the zest of 1 lemon and squeeze in the juice. Leave to soak for 30 minutes.
2. Meanwhile, puree the sweet potato flesh in a food processor, then add the sugar and eggs, one at a time, pulsing after each addition. Pour in the oil, sift in all the flour, then pulse again to combine. Stir through chopped pecans and the apricots, along with their soaking juices, then spoon the mixture into your prepared tin.
3. Bake for 45-60 minutes, until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Transfer to a cooling rack for 5 minutes, then turn out and leave to cool.
4. For the icing, whisk together the cream cheese, icing sugar and zest from the second lemon, reserving a little to garnish. Add the juice of ¼ lemon to loosen. (Don't whisk it too much, or it will go runny.) Spread the icing over the cake, sprinkle with zest and then serve.

### Witches' Broom Cupcakes

3/4 cup plain flour	1 egg
3/4 cup self raising flour	12 pretzel sticks
3/4 cup sugar	3/4 cup butter at room temp
1/4 cup cocoa powder	2 cups icing sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt	3 tablespoons milk
1 teaspoon baking soda	1 teaspoon vanilla
1/3 cup vegetable oil	Orange food colouring
1/2 cup milk	Green food colouring
1/2 teaspoon vanilla	



In a bowl, combine the two kinds of flour, sugar, cocoa powder, salt, and baking soda.

In another bowl, combine vegetable oil, milk, vanilla, and egg. Mix dry and wet mixtures together just until combined. Pour into cupcake tray for the broom head and bake at 180°C or until a cake tester inserted in the centre comes out clean.

Make the butter cream icing: Beat butter until pale and creamy. Add in icing sugar, vanilla and milk and beat until smooth and creamy. Divide icing into separate bowls. Colour three quarters of the icing with orange food colouring, and one quarter with green food colouring.

To decorate: Turn cupcakes upside down and trim into broom head shape as pictured. Insert a pretzel stick into each cake. Using a small star tip, pipe orange icing on the cake. Use a plain tip to pipe a ribbon on the "bristles" using green icing.



*Making Millet Brooms: Bundles of millet heads are put over racks for three weeks to dry, before the millet seed is removed. It is then hand-graded for length and quality. The millet is later bound onto the broom handle using wire, then sewn using a stitching machine. Finally, the broom is trimmed, labelled and packaged.*

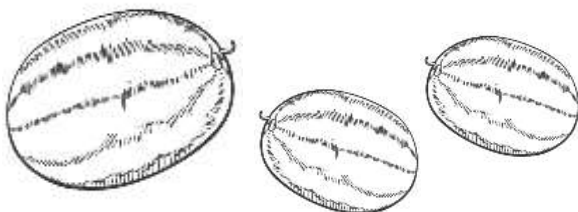

#### Rules

The object of the game is to stack up to 20 bales of hay (open) and 15 bales (junior) to the greatest height in the shortest time possible. One team member must finish seated on top of the highest bale and the stack must stand on its own for 5 seconds to qualify.

Bales must be picked up and carried (not thrown) 5 meters to the stacking area. Teams then construct the highest possible stack using as many of the bales as desired. Teams may hold the stack to keep it from falling after the 5 second time limit has expired to enable measuring.

#### Time Limits

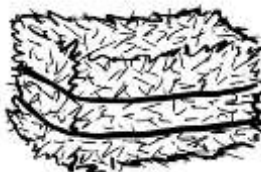
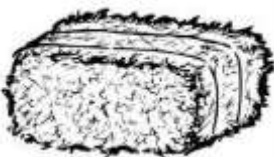
Teams will have a maximum of 5 minutes in the heats and 3 minutes in the final to construct their stack. A whistle will sound once to indicate 30 seconds to go and then twice to signal time up. At the final whistle teams must stop building and one team member must sit on the top bale of the stack.

#### Judging

If more than one team finishes with the stacks the same height, the fastest team will be the winner. The two highest and fastest teams will compete in the finals. The judge's decision is final.



Due to a change of equipment availability,  
2023 will be the final year of the haystacking challenge.



# Rules & Regulations

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## Exhibitors and entries

1. All exhibitors other than life members must pay the normal admission fee.
2. Exhibitors or their agents, when called upon by Stewards or the Committee, shall verify the appropriateness of entries.
3. All entries must be made on the proper entry form by the appropriate due date, and exhibits must be in the hands of the Steward at the designated time.
4. Exhibits must be the exhibitor's property and, except for livestock, must have been either grown or made by the exhibitor.
5. Any exhibit (excluding livestock, equestrian, live animals) that has previously won a prize in the Kununurra Agricultural Show is ineligible to be exhibited again.
6. Any exhibitor who knowingly makes a false entry, or who willingly infringes any of these rules, or whose conduct at the Show has been inappropriate in the opinion of the Committee, is ineligible to receive a prize and may be disqualified for exhibiting by the Committee, for a specific period or indefinitely.
7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or accept conditionally any entries.
8. Stock or other items not eligible for entry under any of the numbered classes may be exhibited by special permission. Certificates of Merit may be awarded for such exhibits, but no prizes will be given.
9. If the Committee has any reason to suspect any exhibit is diseased or dangerous, they reserve the right to refuse admission thereof to the Showground, and/or to remove the exhibit from the Showground at the exhibitor's expense. All livestock will be inspected by a veterinary surgeon if deemed necessary.
10. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident or occurrence that may result in the loss or non-return of any exhibit, including livestock, or any damage or injury done thereby.
11. Exhibits should not be removed from the Show before the designated collection time without permission of the relevant Steward.

## Judging and Awards

12. First, second and third prizes in each class awarded are at the discretion of the Judges. Judges are empowered and instructed not to award prizes for exhibits which they consider are not of sufficient merit.
13. The colours of the ribbons and prize cards shall be Red/White/Blue for Champion; Blue/White for Reserve Champion; Blue for First, Red for Second, and Yellow for Third.
14. A separate entry is not required to qualify for aggregate awards. Three points will be awarded for a first prize, two for a second, and one for a third. In the event of a tie, two points will be for championships. Such additional points will be awarded only to those exhibitors who tie in the initial allocation.
15. All exhibitors must accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Committee.
16. Any protest must be delivered in writing to the Secretary before 2pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a fee of \$50, which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous. The person lodging the protest must produce evidence to support his or her allegations. The Committee's decision on a protest shall be final.
17. All prizes are subject to alteration or reallocation if deemed necessary by the Committee.

## Sites, Stalls and Sideshows

18. Application for space for stands, machinery, implements, sideshows or stalls will be received by the Site Coordinator.

- 
19. Positions will be allocated during the week of the Show, and a fee will be assessed for the space granted. All charges for site space must be paid in full by 4pm on the Saturday of the Show weekend.
  20. Two stall holder's wristbands for each commercial exhibit will be allocated or available at the Secretary's office. These must be retained for the duration of the Show.
  21. Camping for site holders during Show week is at no charge. At all other times, normal caravan park rates apply.
  22. The KAS Committee reserves the right to prohibit from sale at its discretion any dangerous, banned or illegal items.
  23. Site holders and exhibitors are to ensure that sites, displays and exhibits are kept in a clean and tidy condition at all times and that all employees or attendants are clean and tidily dressed, and conduct themselves in an orderly manner, at all times. Failure to comply may result in closure of site, forfeit of site fees and reporting to appropriate authorities.
  24. The site holders shall indemnify KAS against any liability in respect of any breach by the site holder of any law or regulation in effect, including these Rules and Regulations.
  25. All stalls, exhibits, and other material must be removed from the Showground not later than two days after the end of the Show. Any rubbish or refuse remaining will be removed at the site holder's expense.
  26. Games of chance are strictly prohibited. All games must be games of skill. KAS reserves the right to remove any site holder from the Showground if any games on site are declared by a member of the Police or DOCEP to be illegal, or in the event of any infringement by the site holder. In such cases the site holder will forfeit all fee and other payments in connection with the site.
  27. All sideshows must be approved by the Committee before the Show, and operators must present an insurance Certificate of Currency.

### **General**

28. Persons contravening any of these Rules and Regulations shall be ineligible for any prize, and shall forfeit any prize already awarded.
29. No person other than officials shall be allowed in the Show Ring during the ring events, unless otherwise advised.
30. No entertainment is allowed on the Showground without the Committee's permission.
31. Exhibitors must ensure that horse and cattle pens in which their stock is housed are cleaned out. Stall gates must be closed at all times, except when moving animals.
32. The Committee may add to or amend the Schedule in any way and without notice.
33. Any person committing a public nuisance during the Show, or collecting money without permission, will be asked to leave, with assistance from the Police if required. No person so removed shall have any right of action or claim for damages, costs, and expenses or otherwise against the Society.

### **Privacy**

34. The Kununurra Agricultural Society (KAS) may collect information from exhibitors on the entry forms and otherwise, for purposes of organising and conducting the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address & exhibit details in KAS publications or communications. Such information may also be made available to & published in the media.
35. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records be corrected by writing to the KAS President at PO Box 271, Kununurra WA 6743.
